I'm pleased to share with you that 10 athletes will represent Riverside Boat Club at the 2007 World Championships in Munich, Germany later this month!

As you know, Riverside has a rich history of its members performing at the highest levels. In recent years many members have represented the US at the World Championships and Olympic Games and most recently, our own lightweight eight represented the United States at last year's world championships in Eton, England.

This year RBC had athletes competing in a lightweight men's 8+, a lightweight women's quad, and lightweight men's and womens' singles at the World Championships Trials in Princeton, New Jersey. In addition, RBC members, training at the Princeton Training Center, also attended trials. The lightweight men's eight won trials and beat their time standard. In addition, Liane Malcos, rowing in the PTC open women's 4x was also successful. Esther Lofgren, fresh off of a World Championship in the US Under 23 Women's 4x will attend the senior world championships as a spare. The RBC lightweight eight, coached by Bruce Smith, consists of:


I am writing on behalf of our athletes to ask for your support again this year. It will cost each athlete and coach of the 8+ approximately \$3,300 to compete at the 2007 World Championships. RBC's goal is to raise \$33,000 to help these athletes pay for the trip. The crew ran a very successful raffle that took place Thursday August 16th, where \$9,500 was raised. We are still in need of \$23500. In 2005 and 2006 with your support we were very successful helping RBC athletes get to the World Championships. With your generous support this year we can help the 2007 athletes get to the World Championships and achieve their goal.

Riverside is also looking to the future by setting aside a small percentage of the funds raised to add to the long-term fund that will help support future Riverside athletes who participate in the World Championships.
